Art Portfolio for Talented Art Evaluations

For the art portfolio, you should begin a folder of your artwork. Be sure to date your pieces, so we can see your progress. All artwork should be *original* and completed within the **last two years**. Class wide projects that look the same as everyone else's, should **not** be used for more than **two pieces** of your submitted portfolio. Artwork should **not** be on loose leaf notebook paper. The pieces submitted should be finished pieces of artwork. Below are some ideas of things you could include in your portfolio.

- A drawing using a picture from a magazine as the idea. The picture you draw should be larger than the magazine picture. Attach the magazine picture to your drawing.
- > Draw at least two real life objects the size of the actual objects; for example, shoes or fruit would be good objects. Use shading in your pictures.
- ➤ Use your imagination and create a cartoon, not one that is copied. This could be a brief story in cartoon form.
- > You may include other drawings you have done. It is a good idea to include drawings from real life and your imagination. You will not pass the Art Portfolio Screening with only cartoon drawings. You MUST include more than copied cartoons. It is acceptable to include a few copied cartoons, but you must also show that you have drawing skills in other areas.
- ➤ Include a variety of media ~ pencil, pastels, charcoal, ink, paints, collage, and sculptural materials; and techniques ~ drawing, painting, collage, photography, etc.
- ➤ **High School students**: It is recommended you also include self-portraits, landscape compositions, interior compositions, interior and exterior perspectives, and figures in action.
- > Your portfolio should contain a minimum of 5 pieces and not more than 10. You may take pictures of your work if it is large or if it is something that will not fit into a 16 X 20 (maximum) portfolio.

Turn your portfolio into your teacher. Below are the submission guidelines. If your portfolio does not meet these requirements and is not turned in by the due date it **WILL NOT** be screened.

- 1. Place your portfolio in a portfolio no bigger than 16 X 20.
- 2. Fill out the form below and staple to the outside of your folder.
- 3. Submission Deadline: TBD takes place in the Spring, usually March
